Policy and Responsibility

SUBJECT: SUNSCREEN

I. Purpose and Philosophy

In accordance with Utah Code Annotated §53G-9-208, students shall be permitted to possess and self-apply sunscreen at school without a parent or physician's authorization. Additionally, this policy regulates who may apply sunscreen to a student that is unable to self-apply.

II. Definitions

"Sunscreen" means a compound topically applied to prevent sunburn.

"Volunteer School Employee" – means any school-based employee who has consented to volunteer in the administration of sunscreen

III. Possession and Use of Sunscreen

Students may be in possession of and self-apply sunscreen at schools without parent or physician authorization.

Students in possession of sunscreen may not share and/or apply it to other students.

Students who are unable to self-apply sunscreen may have a volunteer school employee apply the sunscreen if the student's parent or legal guardian has provided written consent for the assistance.

School employees may not bring sunscreen to share and/or use with students.

IV. Liability

A volunteer school employee who applies sunscreen on a student in compliance with Utah Code Annotated §53G-9-208 as outlined in this policy and the volunteer school employee's employer are not liable for:

- (a) an adverse reaction suffered by the student as a result of having the sunscreen applied; or
- (b) discontinuing the application of the sunscreen at any time.
